

Experience: The Best of the Isle of Wight Tour. Our tour takes us past the majestic Carisbrooke Castle, an 11th-century towering fortress. We wind down the backbone of the island, taking in the rolling hills and quaint villages dotting the landscape. Portland is a part of Dorset like no other; wild, natural and ruggedly beautiful. With delightful beaches and a wonderful selection of places to eat around the Harbour, West Bay is a favourite destination for visitors.

Day 4 We take in the famous Jurassic Coast with a visit to West Lulworth, where the scenery is stunning, boasting some of the most dramatic geological features including Lulworth Cove and Durdle Door. Later, we enjoy an unforgettable visit at the world's most historically significant collection of armoured vehicles. The museum houses 300 military machines, representing the key battles of every major conflict since the First World War. The awe-inspiring exhibitions tell the story of this British invention; from the mud of the Somme to the beaches of Normandy and the deserts of Iraq – featuring powerful stories from the people that fought in them.

Day 5 We depart Portland after breakfast and make our way to Shaftsbury before the return drive to Chelmsford.

Day 3 We will enjoy a day at leisure in Leysin. We may choose to relax at our hotel, making use of its extensive leisure facilities or make our way to the Berneuse Cable Car, which takes us up to the summit of the mountain for perfect views of Geneva and Mont Blanc on a clear day.

Day 4 This morning, we will head to the Lavaux Vineyards, where we have wine tasting at the outstanding Lavaux Vinorama. After learning all about the wines produced here, we will head for Vevey with time for lunch before embarking on a scenic paddle steamer cruise from Vevey to the elegant town of Montreux, made famous by its yearly jazz festival and its former famous resident, Freddie Mercury. After spending time here, we make our way back to the hotel by coach.

Day 5 This morning we board our coach for the journey across the Col de Mosses through the scenic countryside to the village of Gruyeres. Here we discover how Gruyere cheese is made with a demonstration at La Maison du Gruyere cheese dairy. Afterwards we have time to spend in the village before we travel by bus to Broc, home of the Cailler-Nestle chocolate factory. We find out all about the chocolates made here, with tastings of course! After enjoying the chocolates, we begin our return journey back to Montreux, arriving late afternoon.



Day 6 After breakfast, we head to the chic mountain resort of Gstaad, known as a playground for the rich and famous where we enjoy free time to explore, browsing the designer shops on main street, people watching over coffee or immersing yourself in the mountain



scenery. Later we board our beautiful Golden pass train for a wonderful journey to Lake Geneva, watching the afternoon sun descend to Montreux. On arrival we board our coach back to the hotel.

Day 7 After breakfast, it is time to say goodbye to the fresh mountain air of Switzerland and begin our journey home, with our overnight stay in Dijon.

Upcoming changes for travel to Europe

The European Union is introducing two important changes for travel to Europe. These are:

- \bullet EU Entry/Exit System (EES), which is planned to launch on 10th November 2024
- European Travel Information and Authorisation System (ETIAS), due in mid-2025

EU Entry/Exit Scheme (EES)

The EU Entry/Exit system is a new electronic system that will replace the physical stamping of passports when you go through passport control when arriving in and departing from your destination. It will register all entries and exits to and from the participating European countries, which basically means it will register your movements every time you cross a border in or out of the EU/Schengen area.

European Travel Information and Authorisation System (ETIAS) - expected mid-2025

ETIAS is the EU's new travel authorisation which you will need to apply for ahead of your travels.

It is due to be introduced in mid-2025, but there is not yet an exact date as to when it will come into force.

ETIAS will only cost 7 Euros, around £6. ETIAS is free for those aged 71 and over and valid for 3 years.

There is one official website to apply for an ETIAS which is www.europa.eu/etias. However, as ETIAS is not currently operational, applications via the website are not yet






